Periodic Test (10 marks) – Two periodic tests will be conducted in the entire academic year (one in each term). The weightage of periodic tests will be of 10 marks for each term.

Subject Enrichment Activities (5 marks)-These are subject specific-activities aimed at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. These activities are to be carried out throughout the term, however they will be evaluated at the end of each term.
